Minutes from previous meeting approved.

Christina Brugman from Kirkland's Community Emergency Response team presented the cost of the two-way radios that JNA had previously committed to buy. It was agreed that JNA would purchase 10 at \$40 each plus tax for a total of \$440. It was also agreed that the CERT team would give a presentation at the January JNA General Meeting. The next CERT classes start in March.

Spending of the remaining grant money was discussed. Funding a fence for the Springbrook housing development may not be approvable because it is on private property. Some other ideas were considered, including adding barriers to protect bike lanes, planning a park clean up, purchasing Block Watch signs, purchasing Audubon signs for the parks, purchasing additional holiday lights, or obtaining Starbucks cards for holiday decorating help. It was agreed that more lights would be purchased. Ideas will be gathered and spending of the remaining money will be discussed again at the December 3rd meeting. Remaining funds must be spent by December 12.

It was decided that holiday lights will be installed at Juanita Village on November 18th at 1:00 pm. Volunteers are to gather at Urban Coffee Lounge.

A new grant request is needed for the next biennium. Antonio and Ken agreed to work on this.

There was nothing new to report on the Windsor Vista project.

Brian Magee presented Safety Committee project ideas. He will present three ideas at the JNA General Meeting to get neighborhood input. After receiving input, Brian will fill out the forms to submit one or two ideas in early December. Ideas will be rated in March and the chosen ideas will be funded in April or May.

The three ideas to be presented are:

1. Shared Bike lanes on NE 124th west of 100th NE
2. Pathway on the road leading to the back of Juanita Village
3. Dedicated bike lanes on a portion of NE 116th



Vish Adiga brought up the topic of parking cameras with a software app to locate open spots for the Juanita High School and Springbrook neighborhood parking issues. It may also help with downtown parking or at the Park and Ride lots. This is something he has worked on with City of Bellevue. It was suggested he speak with Kari Page of Kirkland Neighborhood Services Coordinator, or someone at the Kirkland Alliance of Neighborhoods or the Public Works Department.

It was agreed that Ken Albinger will run the November JNA General Meeting in Doug's absence. A reminder will be sent out for the meeting the Thursday before.
